Students are required to take at least one course.

* 1 unit of N400 coursework = 30 hours (3 hours of clinical per week for 10 weeks). **Registration must occur during the quarter in which the residency is experienced, including Summer quarters.** Those completing a residency outside the United States should refer to "General Guidelines for International Student Placement."

NOTE: Graduates are eligible to (a) take the *Advanced Public Health Nurse* examination to earn the credential *Advanced Public Health Nurse Board Certified* (APHN-BC), a certification that is offered by the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC), and (b) apply to the State of California Board of Registered Nursing (CA-BRN) for certification as a CNS.
